Release Date: January 24, 2017

Re: CDCR Inmate Orlando San Juan Camba

On January 24, 2017, during a Board of Parole Hearing for inmate Orlando Camba, conducted at California State Prison Solano in Vacaville, Solano County Deputy District Attorney Robert Jones opposed the release of Camba. The inmate was convicted of 2nd degree murder with the use of a firearm of 17-year old William Lowe at the corner of Pennsylvania Avenue and Kansas Street in Fairfield. Camba, along with his brother and two co-workers, who Camba later admitted were gang members, were riding in a car, when the victim crossed the road coming very close to the car. Camba and the other occupants didn't like how close the victim had come to the car so they made an abrupt u-turn and returned to the victim's location to confront him. As they were returning to where the victim was, Camba was given a gun by one of the co-workers. When they got to the victim's location, Camba pointed the gun at the victim and shot him once in the chest. The bullet entered through the right side of the victim's chest and lodged in his heart. He was pronounced dead upon arrival at North Bay Medical center. Camba told his brother to drive away and the car accelerated rapidly and left the scene. Camba escaped but was arrested in Cordelia one week later.

Camba was convicted of the murder and received a sentence of 19 years to Life. Camba has been denied parole two times since his first parole board hearing in 2009. On January 24<sup>th</sup>, the Board of Parole Hearings had a split decision, one commissioner for a 3 year denial and the other commissioner to set a release date. This will now be heard in front of the entire parole board of 13 commissioners to determine if he will be granted parole or denied parole.
