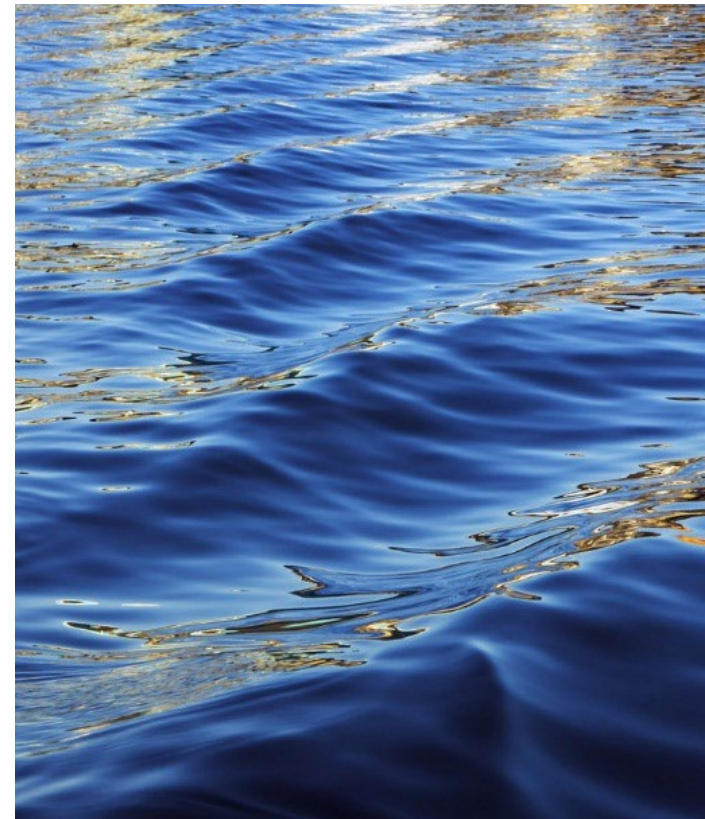

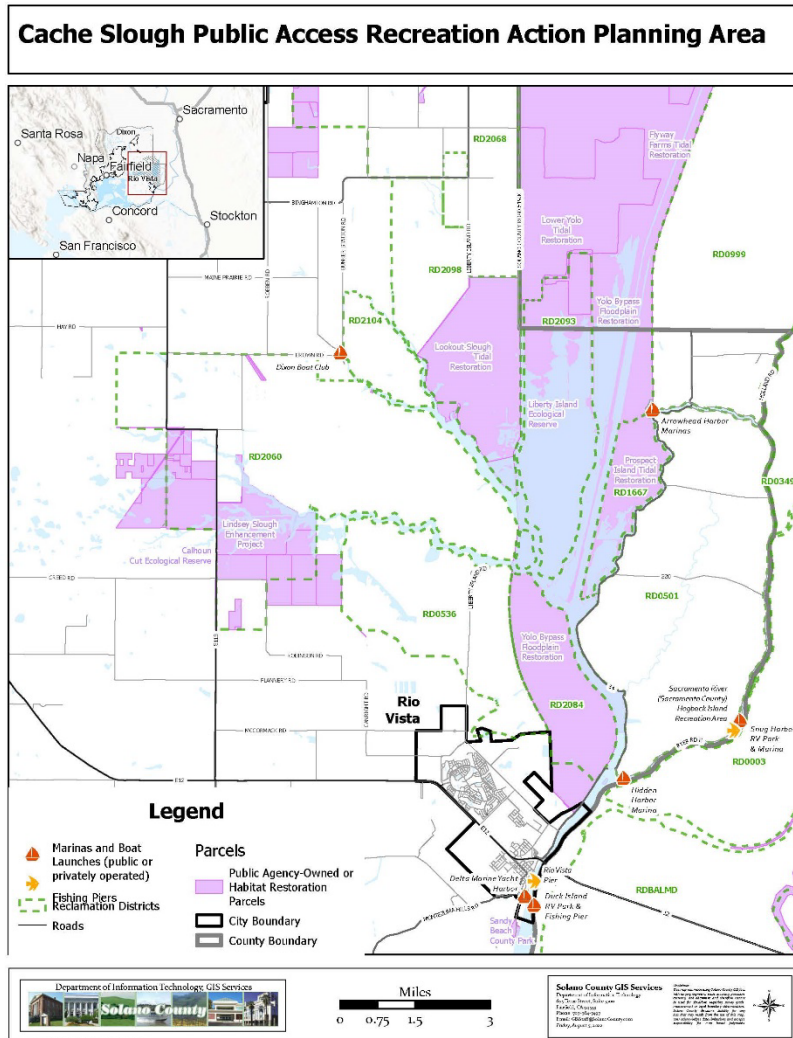

Concerns or Issues to Address

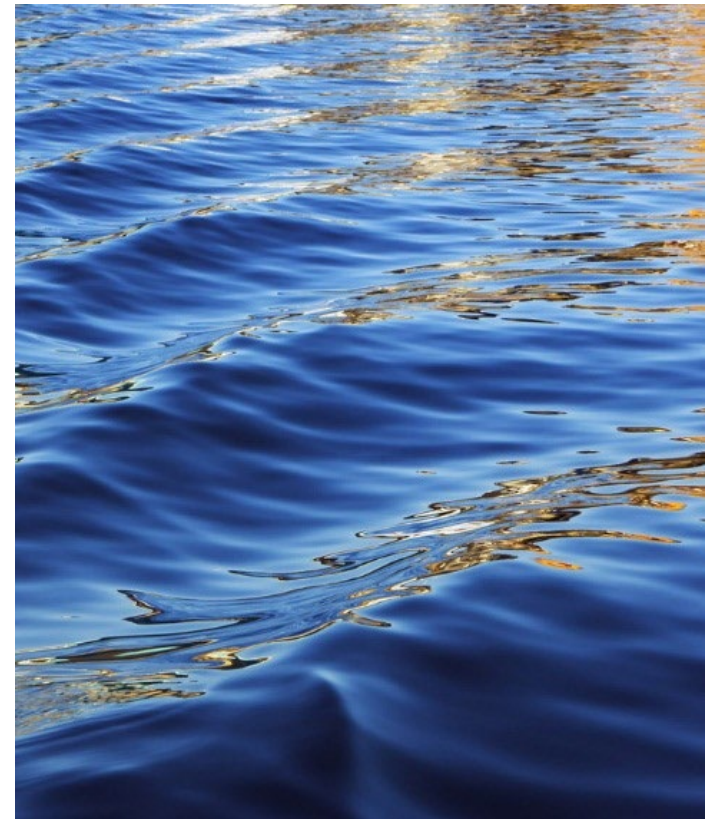
- Private land access
