## **New Vet Center in Fairfield**



**U.S. Department  
of Veterans Affairs**

On Friday, the Department of Veterans Affairs announced the addition of three new Vet Centers and six Vet Center Outstations (smaller satellite locations) to improve access to

counseling for Veterans and service members.

One of the locations is in the city of Fairfield.

Vet Center counselors and outreach staff, many of whom are Veterans themselves, are experienced and prepared to discuss the tragedies of war, loss, grief, and transition after trauma. Vet Center teams proactively work in the community, reducing barriers to care and improving access to care.

The Solano County Vet Center Outstation will be located at 420 Executive Ct. N, Suite A, Fairfield and is anticipated to open in early 2024.

## Medicare Open Enrollment

**From now until December 7**, those already enrolled in Medicare can make changes to their current health plan and those who now qualify can enroll. Existing health and drug plans can make changes to their cost, coverage, and provider/pharmacy network each year, so it's important to review which plans best fit your needs.

If you make less than \$22,000 per year (\$30,000 for married couples), you may qualify for "Medicare Part D Extra Help." This program could cut your Medicare Part D drug costs to no more than \$4.15 for generic prescriptions and \$10.35 for brand-name drug prescriptions.

## Need a ride to the doctor?

You can now get a ride to and from your doctor visits at no charge. As a Kaiser Permanente Medicare health plan member, you can get a ride to and from your appointments at no cost. Your plan covers up to 24 one-way trips (50 miles per trip) per calendar year.

To schedule a ride for rideshare, taxi, or private transportation service, call 1-877-930-1477 (TTY 711). You can also schedule online at [medicaltrip.net](http://medicaltrip.net) or download the MTM Link Member app. To download the app on your device, visit the App Store (Apple) or Google Play (Android) and search for MTM Link Member App.

For wheelchair van or gurney van transportation service, call 1-833-226-6760.

Request your ride at least 3 business days (Monday through Friday) before your appointment. If you have an urgent last-minute appointment, call as soon as you can.

You can get rides for doctor appointments, medical services such as lab or X-ray, and picking up medications or medical equipment. This benefit is limited to Kaiser Medicare members who had coverage through an employer or who were also on Medi-Cal.

## Need Help Paying Your Energy Bill? These Programs Can Help

This winter, colder weather and darker skies may cause your energy bill to climb. Did you know our local electricity provider,



MCE, can help keep these costs down? Take advantage of these tips and tricks to save with small changes at home, and see if you qualify for any discount or bill relief programs.

### **Tips and Tricks:**

- **Don't use big electric appliances between 4-9 p.m.**, when electricity costs more. Small changes like doing laundry in the morning, preheating your home early in the day, and using fewer lights can make a big difference in your bill.
- **Consider switching to energy-efficient holiday lighting.** Holiday lights use [65 kilowatt-hours a month](#) on average. That's almost as much as your [refrigerator](#)! Switch to LED and solar-powered options to save on your bill.
- **Use timers and smart-strips.** Electronics draw electricity any time they're plugged in, even when not in use! Using the on-off switch on a smart-strip outlet and putting lighting on timers to turn on and off automatically can help dramatically. It's estimated that these "vampire" appliances represent [up to 10%](#) of your annual energy usage.

### **Bill Savings Programs:**

- [California Alternate Rates for Energy \(CARE\)](#) provides discounts of 35% on electricity and 20% on gas costs for income-qualifying homes.
- [Family Electric Rate Assistance \(FERA\)](#) offers an 18% monthly electric bill discount for income-qualifying households of 3 or more people.
- [Medical Baseline Allowance](#) offers savings for residents with a qualifying medical device or medical condition and extra notifications in advance of a Public Safety Power Shutoff.

### **Late Payment and Debt Relief:**

- The [Arrearage Management Plan](#) offers debt-forgiveness up to \$8,000 to customers who have fallen behind on monthly bills. Customers must be enrolled in the [CARE or FERA](#) programs and be 90 days past due on at least \$500 of their energy bill.
- The [Relief for Energy Assistance Through Community Help](#) program offers a one-time energy bill credit up to \$300 when a sudden hardship occurs and households need additional support.
- The [Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program](#) offers up to \$3,000 in assistance with energy costs in addition to [free energy efficiency upgrades](#).



## Public hearings

### Fairfield Forward 2050 City Council Study Session: Preferred Plan



**On December 19**, the Fairfield City Council will hold a study session on the General Plan Preferred Plan. The Preferred Plan communicates the community's vision for how the City will grow and develop over the next 25+ years and provides the foundation for more detailed policies.

The Council has held six study sessions over the past 22 months on the Preferred Plan and provided direction at the meeting on September 12. At the December 19 session, the Council will be asked to confirm direction of the Preferred Plan guiding policies and provide any additional ideas or suggestions to be reflected in the General Plan document, which will be developed in the coming months.

### Benicia Parks, Trails, Open Space Master Plan





The city of Benicia began the process of updating the 1997 Parks, Trails and Open Space Master Plan in 2021. After extensive community input, the Parks and Community Services Department has completed a draft of the Master Plan for public review.

The document is in its final form regarding recommendations provided by the community for improvements to the parks, trails and open space system. The draft was presented to the Parks, Recreation, and Cemetery Commission on Oct. 18, 2023, at which time public input on the draft was welcomed.

## Updates from around Solano County

### **Solano County Sheriff's Office Apprehends Suspect in hate crime vandalism**



The Solano County Sheriff's Office Investigations Team has arrested a suspect in connection with a hate crime vandalism incident that occurred at Thompson's Corner Saloon, in unincorporated Fairfield, the sheriff's office announced this week.

On August 8, someone spray painted red swastikas and racial slurs on the exterior walls of the saloon. A tip from a community member drew attention to several racial slurs posted on social media specifically targeting Thompson's Corner Saloon. Warrants for digital evidence from the social media provider, successfully uncovering the account responsible for the offensive posts. Officials also said the same individual matched the physical description of the suspect captured in the surveillance footage and resided in close proximity to the targeted business.

This week, the Solano Sheriff's Office executed a search warrant at the suspect's apartment. Substantial evidence directly linking the individual to the crime was recovered. Following a comprehensive interview, the suspect, identified as 26-year-old Brendan Moore of Fairfield, admitted to the criminal act of defacing the property with hate speech.

Moore was arrested and taken into custody and is facing pending charges related to the vandalism.

Congratulations to Sheriff Tom Ferrara and his office for getting this individual off of our streets.

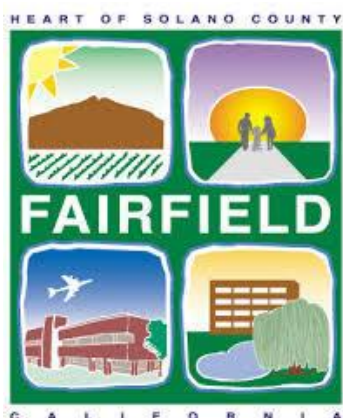
## Second Annual Chanukah Celebration
